

## After Opening the Fast

Recite Bismillāhi wabarakatillāh, then open the fast with dates and water. Thereafter, recite:

O Allāh! For You I have fasted and with your provisions I have opened my fast. (Abū Dāwūd)

The thirst has been quenched, the vessels have been moistened and if Allāh wills, the reward has been attained. (Abū Dāwūd)

- One should utilise the time before iftar in du'a as Rasūlullāh said, There are three groups of people whose du'a is not rejected; the fasting person until he breaks the fast... (Ahmad)
- The simplest way to earn the reward of a fasting person is to offer dates at the time of ifṭār. Rasūlullāh ≋ said,

Whoever gives a fasting person something to break his fast with, then for him will be reward equivalent to his (i.e. the fasting person's reward), without it decreasing anything from the reward of the fasting person. (Tirmidhī)

Whilst opening the fast one should not become negligent from responding to the adhān as Rasūlullāh ♯ said,

Whoever does this (i.e. responds to the adh $\bar{a}n$ ) with conviction will enter Jannah. (Muslim)

Thereafter, one should recite the masnun du'a after the adhan as Rasulullah said for the reciter.

My intercession has become incumbent for him. (Muslim, Al-Bayhaqī)
